CPSI is down...the 3 dreaded words.....

Per HIPAA laws and per our policies, we are required to have a contingency plan in place to protect our data and provide continuous patient care. One part of the Contingency Plan is the "Emergency Mode Operation Plan", or better known as "Downtime Procedures". Each department should have their own plan which states how you continue doing your job in the absence of a computer system.

The recent server breakdown forced us to practice our downtime procedure for an extended period of time. How did your department do? The use of these downtime procedures real time is the best time to analyze your current plan and update for any problems you have discovered. We immediately discovered there had been some disconnect and lack of information in the use of the Nursing backup PC, which is key for nursing to continue taking care of its patients.

In the next few days, department managers will be receiving a questionnaire from IT to discuss issues they found during downtime procedures and give them an opportunity to change their downtime procedure plan to account for any issues. Please make your manager aware of anything you think can be improved.

And again, a big thanks to all of you for your positive reaction for I know what many felt was a catastrophe. It was a good learning experience, and since we are required to practice these on a regular basis, we can now document that we have done so. Good patient care is always the most important thing in any situation and we were A+ in that area. Now it's time to use this mini disaster to improve our processes.
